Anton and Mary (Wilebski) Kuznia

Anton Kuznia was born November 6, 1873, in Poland to Albert and Hedwig (Krzyzosiak) Kuznia. It is believed that Anton came to America about the year 1881 with his father and two brothers, Frank and Stanley. His mother and other brothers and sister came in 1884.

Anton married Mary Ann Wilebski. She was born September 6, 1883, to Frank and Antonette (Januczek) Wilebski. Her brothers and sisters are: Joseph, Thomas (who married Anna Kuznia), Frances Olosonaski, Sam, Peter, John, Anna Clark, Antonette Price, Stanley, Victoria Loby, and Stella Kollinger.

Mary was from Lancaster, Minnesota, where they made their tome while they were married. On December 7, 1903, she gave with to a daughter, Leokadia. On December 27, at twenty years of age, she died of blood poisoning after childbirth. After she died from these complications, many young girls of the community were sared to get married. There had been other such deaths, and it had tappened often enough.

Anton was a carpenter by trade. He made most of the coffins in early 1900's, especially the coffins for little children. He also all a lot of houses during World War I. He did a lot of building in Warsaw, North Dakota, area. Anton was so busy building in Warsaw area that he couldn't come and help build the home of parents, Albert and Hedwig, so Tom Wilebski built it. He also louds for Anton Szklarski (now owned by John Szklarski in sburg Townshp, Section 35), Joe Kuznia, and Mike Kuznia, Sr.

(now owned by Mike Kuznia, Jr. in Wright Township, Section 7). Anton also built a house for his brother, Bert, on Section 3 of Wanger Township. In 1944, this house was moved to Section 23 of Sinnott Township. The Emil Kuznia family now lives there.

Anton also built the John Silewski home, which is located straight west of Stephen on the North Dakota side of the Red River. Anton worked for John Silewski for twenty-three years during harvest time. As John's son, Tommy Silewski, recalls, Anton was the only man his father didn't yell at. The Kasprowicz and Silewski children fondly remember Anton because he always brought a big bag of candy for the children when he came to stay at their house. John Silewski was great for hunting, and he could tan any kind of hide. After he got the hide just right, Anton would then get to work making harnesses and shoes and any other things they needed made from leather.

From 1909 to 1914, during the winter months, Stanley Bajdek, Sr. was working in a lumber camp by Spooner, Minnesota, which is across the river from Baudette. Stanley asked his bosses, Joe and Jack Maloney from west of Stephen, if he could bring some Polish boys with him to work because he was lonely. There weren't any Polish people at the camp. The Maloneys said it was alright, so Mike, Joe, and Anton Kuznia came along with Stanley. Anton got the job of blacksmith, for which he got paid \$50 a month, with room and board. Mike and Stanley were teamsters, and Joe was a loader. They got \$35 a month. The camp was eight miles from Spooner, and there were about fifty to sixty men working. Stanley remembers that the food was very good, and they got plenty to eat, but they didn't get any lunches. Anton was the only blacksmith. He had so much work to do, he had to work in the evenings and Sunday so he could catch up.

Anton was also remembered for his knife making. He made knives for all the Kuznias and kept them sharp.

After his daughter, Leokadia, married John Kazmierczak, he made his home with them until his death on March 26, 1942, from internal bleeding following an unsuccessful operation in Thief River Falls, Minnesota.

JOHN AND LEOKADIA [KUZNIA] KAZMIERCZAK

Leokadia Kuznia is the only child of Anton and Mary (Wilebski) Kuznia. She was born December 7, 1903, at the home of her grandparents, Albert and Hedwig Kuznia. Her mother, Mary, died three weeks after her birth. As a baby, Leokadia lived with the Tom Wilebski family until Grandma Hedwig moved to Florian. Then she lived with Grandma until her death in 1925. Leokadia then went to live with her Uncle Mike and Aunt Elizabeth Kasprowicz for three years until her wedding in 1928.

On November 20, 1928, Leokadia married John Kazmierczak. the son of Mikolai and Lucy (Szczepaniak) Kazmierczak. (On records at the courthouse in Warren, Lucy's last name is also spelled Iczefaniak). John was born August 23, 1906. His brothers are Anton and Frank. Sister Zofia died as an infant. His mother was born in Wisconsin. She died in 1911, and Nick married Julia Borowicz. She was born in Minnok, Illinois. They had eight children: Joseph, Polly (Mrs. Peter P. Kuznia), Dorothy Rapacz, Raymond, Peter, Roman, Leonard, and a son who died at an early

age. John's father was born Novmeber 15, 1880, at Czenien, Poland. In February of 1901, he left Poland by way of Hamberg, Germany, on a vessel named "Grofvalder" and arrived at the port of New York about February 15. This information is taken from his application for citizenship on November 27, 1916.

Leokadia and John were married in Florian. The wedding feast was at the Mike Kasprowicz farm, with a dance at Florian. There was no priest at Florian, so the day before the wedding, the members of the wedding party went to Drayton, North Dakota, to have their confessions heard. Father John B. Gans of St. Stephen's parish came and married them.

They made their home on the present Roman Kuznia farm. After

a few years, Anton Kuznia and John built the house where John still lives.

They had ten children: Mickoli, Mary Ann, Lucy, Dory, John Jr., Timothy, Scholastica, Henry, Dorothy, and Anthony. When Tony, Henry, and Dorothy were children, they were chased by a bull. They ran to the barn and hid there until some adults came to rescue them. Henry was three years old when he tried to milk a cow. It didn't work; he ended up with a broken leg.

After having surgery to remove her leg, Leokadia died in February of 1965. John still lives in their farm home in rural Stephen, Minnesota, with his son, Mickeli.

MICKOLI KAZMIERCZAK Stephen, Minnesota

Mickoli Kazmierczak was born in 1929, the first child of John and Leokadia (Kuznia) Kazmierczak. For a number of years, Mickoli has been a special officer for all public doings in Florian. He was sworn in by the Marshall County Sheriff.

He farms with his brothers, Henry and Tony, and resides at the family farm home in rural Stephen with his father, John Sr.

JOSEPH AND MARY ANN [KAZMIERCZAK] WALTER, JR. Route 1 Clements, Minnesota 56224

Mary Ann Kazmierczak was born in 1930, the second child of John and Leokadia (Kuznia) Kazmierczak. On November 29, 1958, at Assumption Catholic Church in Florian, Minnesota, she married Joseph Walter, Jr., the son of Joseph Sr. and Magdalena (Heiling) Walter. The Walter name is of German origin and means "woodworker"; Heiling is also German. Joseph was born in 1930. He has one sister, Mary Schunk, and his brother, Jerome, is married to Scholastica Kazmierczak, Mary Ann's sister.

Joseph and Mary Ann have seven children: Edward, Eugene, Bernard, Monica, Helen, Lois, and Grace.

LUCY KAZMIERCZAK

Lucy Kazmierczak was born in 1932, the third child of John and Leokadia (Kuznia) Kazmierczak. She lived at the family home with her parents and brother, Mickoli.

Lucy was a very active member of the Assumption Ladies of Florian, taught C.C.D. classes, and for many years was called upon to be one of the main cooks at the local weddings. She was also a very active member of the P.N.A. Lucy helped out at many area homes, especially after the mother would come home with a new baby. Lucy died unexpectedly in 1978.

DORY AND DARLENE [DEROSIER] KAZMIERCZAK 15080 Oakhill Road North Marine on St. Croix, Minnesota 55047

Dory Kazmierczak was born at home in 1933, the fourth child of John and Leokadia (Kuznia) Kazmierczak. He graduated from Stephen High School in 1952 and then served in the U.S. Army.

On October 6, 1962, at St. Anthony's Church in Terrebonne, Minnesota, he married Darlene Derosier, the daughter of Joseph and Minne (LaCoursiere) Derosier. Both of Darlene's parents are of French descent. Darlene was born in 1940. She has three sisters: Bernice Valley, Noella Delorme, and Marcella Leydecker; and two brothers, Don and Herb.

Dory is employed as a mechanical designer. They have five children.


JOHN, JR. AND IRENE [WOINAROWICZ] KAZMIERCZAK Strandquist, Minnesota 56758


