Vincent and Wanda (Gratzek) Kuznia

Vincent Kuznia was born August 13, 1893, in Wright Township, Marshall County, Minnesota, to Albert and Hedwig (Krzyzosiak) Kuznia. At that time, the family lived in a log house which was dismantled when the new house was built in 1912. As a child and young man, he helped his parents on their farm.

Transportation in Vincent's early manhood was either by foot or horse. Once, while returning home from seeing his bride-to-be, he was walking across country. It was dark, and just as he was crossing a fence, a prairie chicken flew up. He was frightened and hurried so so fast he left part of his best suit on the fence.

Vincent married Wanda Gratzek in the Assumption Catholic Church in Florian, Minnesota, on November 21, 1916. Father Anthony Drevinicki officiated at the ceremony. The day was cold and cloudy, but there was no snow. After the wedding, they made their home on the Kuznia farm, which was given to him, as he was the youngest son. They raised grain, hogs, sheep, and cattle. They were blessed with six boys: Valerian, Edmund, Bernard, Ambrose, Vincent Jr., and Hilary; and two girls: Evelyn and Ludvine. Besides taking care of the growing family, Wanda was a big help to her husband, often working in the field and milking cows. She also raised turkeys, geese, and ducks.

Along with all the good times, Vincent and Wanda had their share of hardships. In 1918, the big flu epidemic hit the Florian

community. At that time, Vincent's unmarried brothers, Joe and Ben, were living with them. Joe and Ben had gone to help do chores for their sick neighbors, and both Vincent and Wanda were taken sick, so Joe was called home. On returning home, he found no bread in the house, so he decided to bake. The bread turned so hard no one could eat it.

In November of 1929, they proudly bought their first car. It was a Model "A" Ford town sedan, which cost about \$750. Being one of the first cars in the community, Vincent was often asked to take relatives to the doctor in Crookston, Minnesota, or Drayton, North Dakota. When you took ten gallons of cream to town, you could buy enough groceries to fill the back seat of the car, put five gallons of gas in the car, and then go to the tavern for a big glass of beer, which cost five cents.

They farmed with horses until 1935. That year, they bought a new tractor for \$300 and a new three-bottom plow for \$140. As a trade-in, they traded a horse for which they received \$100. Fuel or distillate at that time cost five cents a gallon.

One nice evening in the winter of 1941, Vincent and his sons. Edmund and Ambrose, were to go to Ben Kuznia's and listen to the Joe Louis fight. Instead of going, they decided to listen to the radio in their Dodge car, which was parked in the garage behind the house. When the fight was over, they were surprised to see that a blinding snow storm had come up. The garage is only thirty feet from the house, and if it hadn't been for a lantern light shining through the kitchen window, they would never have made it to the house. Wanda was surprised to see them. She thought they were safe at Ben's.

On July 13, 1943, a big wind storm hit the Kuznia farm. It turned over the threshing machine and twisted the log barn, which was built in 1888. (This barn is still used today as a hog farrowing shed.) After the storm, Vincent was checking the barn when he fell down a chute in the hayloft. He was laid up with broken ribs and bruised.

In January of 1944, Vincent and Wanda decided to take a vacation to Detroit. Michigan, for a couple of months. They could leave the farm, as Edmund and his wife were there to help run it.

Even though one had a tractor, you had horses to help make hay. clean the barn, etc. One day, Vincent went into the barn, and a horse, which had been a cripple, was lying and couldn't get up. He decided to walk to the front of the manger to unsnap the horse's halter. While walking to the front, the horse started kicking. Vincent was caught off guard and was kicked back and forth. He received a broken collar bone and many bruises. The next day, his brother, Ben, decided it was time to shoot the horse.

When the P.N.A. was started in 1946, the Vincent Kuznia family were the first members.

On August 6, 1950, Vincent and three of the boys decided to go blueberry picking east of Wannaska, Minnesota. On their way home, they stopped at the Englund store for a six-pack of beer. When Vincent brought the beer to the counter, Frank Banaszewski told him, "Vincent, I don't think you'd better buy that beer. You can't afford it." They soon found out what he meant when he told them that while they were gone berry picking, a hail storm had come and taken all the crops. They had no hail insurance.

In October of 1955, Vincent was involved in a car accident. He

was taken to the hospital in Crookston, Minnesota, where he remained until he died on November 5. He was 62 years old at the time.

Wanda was born November 11, 1896, to John and Valerie (Schufletowski) Gratzek in Wright Township, Marshall County, Minnesota. Both of her parents came from Poland; John at the age of seventeen, and Valerie when she was eight. They lived to celebrate their 53rd wedding anniversary. John died June 14, 1929, and Valerie died July 3, 1939. Wanda's sisters are: Salomae (Mrs. Joseph Gajeski), Lucy (Mrs. Albert Wanderski). Angie (Mrs. William Borowicz), Praxsada (Mrs. Martin Yutrzenka). Mary (Mrs. Anton Budziszewski), Emelia (Mrs. Joseph Przybylski). Kathryn (Mrs. Andrew Rominski). Wanda's brothers are: Dr. Thomas, who married Theresa Olyczniak; John, who married Stella Przybylski; and Dr. Frank, who married Mary Wienglinski.

Wanda is proud to say that she has 44 grandchildren and over 50 great grandchildren. She lives in her own home on the Kuznia homestead, Route 1, Box 137, Stephen, Minnesota 56757.

As a boy, I walked to country school in Florian. Once, when my folks went visiting, Evelyn and I were boiling candy, and I smelled it to see if it was burning. I stuck my nose in too far and burned it on the fudge. I ran out and got snow and held it to my nose, but despite my efforts. I had a large blister on my nose in the morning. That morning, Ma said to Dad, "You'd better haul the kids to school from now on because look how this boy froze his nose walking from school yesterday." The folks never did find out what really happened to my nose.

As a young man, I helped my dad with his farming, until I enlisted in the Armed Forces in 1941. I was sent overseas to the Aleutian Islands, Alaska, in 1942 and spent the next two years there. Following my overseas duty, I was given a two-week leave. It was during that time that I asked Loretta Irene Price, daughter of John and Antoinette, to be my bride. We were married on June 20, 1944. We lived in Riverside, California, for six months, as I was stationed at Camp Haan. I completed my five years of service in 1945, following a year's duty in the Philippine Islands.

In 1946, I bought our farm in Wright Township. I started farming with nine milking cows and four heifers. An old log barn was used until 1952, when I expanded and bought the barn presently on the farm. The year 1948 was when we first got electricity on the farm. We had the first yard light in Wright Township.

Loretta, James, our oldest son, and I milked twenty cows by hand until 1963, when I bought a milking machine and bulk tank. After this, we milked over thirty cows.

Times were hard, so Loretta, the oldest children, and I had to work together. There was wood to cut and haul, water to carry, snow to melt until we were able to modernize the house. During the hard winters, while the older children went to country school, my brother

Edmund, and I often had to pick them up with horses and a sleigh.

While my sons were at home, with their help I was able to run a big pig operation. I was forced to sell the pigs in 1974 following a heart attack. Most of my sons were gone from home at this time. I continued in the dairy business until 1976, when I sold all my livestock. In 1978, I sold 160 acres of land to my youngest son, Valerian, Jr., who is presently helping me farm.

In 1980, we celebrated our 36th anniversary. To this union, eight children were born: James, Philip, Valerie, Thaddeus, Henry, Valerian Jr., Joan, and Judith. Our children have made us very happy by blessing us with twenty-one grandchildren.

JAMES AND IONE [VOYTILLA] KUZNIA Stephen, Minnesota 56757

On August 22, 1946, James John Kuznia was born to Loretta (Price) and Valerian Kuznia, Sr. at Warren, Minnesota, in Marshall County.

James graduated from the Argyle Public School in 1964. After graduation, he farmed with his father until 1968, when he became employed with Francis DeLisle in construction work.

In 1976, he and Philip started a construction business called Kuznia Builders, which is still operating.

James joined the National Guard unit in Thief River Falls in 1964. This was for six years. He spent his basic training in Fort Jackson, South Carolina.

On October 28, 1967, he married Ione Yvonne Voytilla at the Assumption Catholic Church in Florian. She is the daughter of Theodore and Mabel (Olson) Voytilla. She has two brothers: Earl and Darrell Voytilla.

After their marriage, they lived at rural Argyle for six years. At this time, James built a house of his own near Stephen. This is where they live now.



On October 17, 1947, Philip Thomas Kuznia, the second son of Valerian, Sr. and Loretta (Price) Kuznia, was born at the Warren Hospital in Marshall County.

My first three years of school, I attended District 50 country school, after which I went to Argyle Public School and graduated in 1965. I attended Northland Junior College in Thief River Falls for two years and graduated in 1967. After graduation, I was employed at Arctic Enterprises, Inc., as a welder.

I enlisted in the army on May 20, 1968, for three years. I took my basic training at Ft. Lewis, Washington. I received the highest training score in the battalion, and at graduation, I was presented with a trophy for being an outstanding trainee. I was transferred to Fort Ord in California, Fort Carson in Colorado, and Fort Rucker in Alabama, where I received 13 months of training before leaving for the Republic of Vietnam on August 17, 1969. 

VALERIAN AND CHARLENE [CIEKLINSKI] KUZNIA, JR. Argyle, Minnesota 56713




In 1978, I bought 160 acres of land from my father and am now presently farming with him, raising hogs and working with Jim and Phil.

We are members of the Assumption Catholic Church at Florian, Minnesota. I am a lector at church and a member of the parish church council.







We enjoy traveling and have taken many winter vacations to various parts of the United States.





BERNARD AND EMILY [GRYSKIEWICZ] KUZNIA



THOMAS AND MARLYS [KUZNIA] KITTELSON Sauk Centre, Minnesota



TIMOTHY AND PATRICIA [PAULSON] KUZNIA RR 1, Box 309B Aurora, Minnesota 55705





PETRONELLA KUZNIA Strandquist, Minnesota 56758



We miss Minnesota a lot and are planning to move back and build a home in the future.


JEFFREY AND DONIS [BOSS] KUZNIA 2149 Fairmount Avenue St. Paul, Minnesota


